

## Preparing for Surgery

If you come down with an illness of any kind close to your surgery date (for example, an upper respiratory tract infection), please contact Pre-Anesthesia at Tucson Medical Center (520-324-1446) and Ear & Hearing at the Center for Neurosciences (520-795-7750) to let BOTH facilities know.

## Before Your Procedure

### Pre-Anesthesia Testing

Prior to your scheduled procedure, you may need to undergo Pre-Anesthesia Evaluation by personnel at Tucson Medical Center. TMC will contact you directly, perform a phone interview, and schedule a pre-anesthesia testing appointment if required. If you do not hear from them at least 3 days prior to surgery, please call (520) 324-1446.

### Bring the following information to the pre-anesthesia assessment:

- Past and current health problems as well as dates for any previous surgical procedures.
- Bring all current medications, vitamins, supplements, and over-the-counter medications that you are taking. If unable to bring in the medications, please provide a complete list, preferably from your pharmacy, of current medications including name, dose, how you take it and directions. Include on the list any vitamins, supplements and over-the-counter medications.
- Results of any recent lab tests, EKGs or chest X-rays.
- Current insurance information. If applicable, patients may pay their co-payment at this time or may be directed to a TMC financial counselor for payment arrangements.
- Medical power of attorney.
- Living will.

Based on their assessment, Pre-Anesthesia at TMC may recommend additional preoperative testing or a visit with your primary care physician or particular specialists (for example, cardiology).

### The Days Immediately Prior to Your Operation

- Solid foods and non-clear liquids (like coffee, milk, juice with ANY particulate matter) must be stopped at midnight the night before surgery.
- You are allowed to have water until 3 hours before your scheduled operation.
- If you are on medications for your heart, blood pressure, or breathing, please take them the morning of surgery with a small sip of water unless specifically instructed to stop by Dr. Jacob's office or by TMC personnel.
- If you use inhalers, please bring them the day of surgery.
- Do not take your usual medications for diabetes control the morning of surgery unless instructed to do so by Dr. Jacob's office or TMC Pre-Anesthesia. Do NOT take any metformin the morning of surgery.
- Shower with an antimicrobial soap (for example, Dial soap) the evening before and the morning of your operation.
- You may brush your teeth the morning of surgery, but do not swallow any liquid.
- Do NOT shave the surgical area 48 hours prior to your operation

## Day of Your Procedure

Arrive at TMC two hours before your surgery time. Surgery waiting areas have limited seating. In consideration of others, please limit the number of people waiting.

- Bring a photo ID.
- Bring a means of payment, if payment has not already been completed.
- Bring a complete list, preferably from your pharmacy, of current medications including name, dose, how you take it and other directions. Include vitamins, supplements and over-the-counter medications.
- Remove all jewelry, including body piercings, hairpins, false eyelashes, contact lenses and all other accessories.
- Leave all jewelry and other valuables at home.
- Wear eyeglasses instead of contact lenses if possible.
- If you wear dentures, eyeglasses or contact lenses, please bring a storage case or container.
- Do not wear makeup.
- Wear loose fitting, easy-to-remove clothing. The hospital provides a gown but you may bring your own pajamas, slippers and robe to wear home.
- You will **NOT be allowed to drive yourself home** from the hospital after surgery. Therefore, you **MUST** make arrangements for transportation to and from the hospital on the day of surgery. Also, you **MUST have someone stay with you for at least 24-hours** after your operation.

### Parking

Free valet parking is available at the TMC Orthopedic and Surgical Tower entrance, provided Monday - Friday 5 a.m. - 7 p.m. Free parking is provided outside each entrance as well as in nearby parking garages on the northeast and west sides of campus. Outpatients are encouraged to use valet services. Gratuities are accepted.

### Transportation Assistance at TMC

TMC Auxiliary provides shuttle services inside the hospital and from parking lots. Shuttle services can be requested within each entrance, Monday - Friday 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. by dialing ext. 4-5888 on conveniently located hallway phones. Wheelchairs are available inside each entrance. If none are available, dial 4-1111 on a hallway phone or ask the volunteer behind the information desk for assistance.

### When You Arrive at the Hospital

- Enter through the TMC Orthopedic and Surgical Tower entrance, proceed to the third floor, and check-in at the patient check-in kiosks.
- Patients will be brought to the preoperative holding area. Here they will meet with their surgical team as preparation for surgery is completed, including marking of the surgical site. Family may be asked to wait in the nearest lobby.
- Children who are not patients are not permitted to be in the preoperative or recovery areas. Please make arrangements for their care.
- If your child is having surgery, a parent or legal guardian must remain in the waiting room **at all times** during their operation

## After Surgery

Patients recover in the Post Anesthesia Care Unit, PACU, or recovery room. Visitation is normally not permitted in the PACU to protect the privacy of all patients. The surgeon will speak with family after the surgery by phone or sometimes, in person.

Patients staying in the hospital overnight are transferred to their room from PACU. Family will be notified when this occurs. Please let us know if there is anything we can do to make your experience with us more comfortable.

## Going Home

**You will NOT be allowed to drive yourself home from the hospital after surgery.** Therefore, you **MUST** make arrangements for transportation to and from the hospital on the day of surgery. Also, you **MUST** have someone stay with you for 24-hours after your surgery. If personnel from E&H @ CNS cannot confirm that such arrangements have been made, your surgery will be rescheduled.

Two adults should accompany children whenever possible: one to drive and one to take care of the child. You may want to bring a pillow and blanket to use in the car and any physical aids (walkers, crutches, etc.) that may be needed.
